



NSSE 2006 – Highlights

College of Social and Behavioral Sciences (SBS)

- SBS first-year students and seniors reported that they more often, ‘included diverse perspectives in class discussions or assignments’ than UA students in general and AAU peers.
- SBS seniors reported that they less often ‘made a presentation in class’.
- Both first-years and senior reported less experience with working with classmates outside of class the UA and AAU sample.
- Fewer numbers of SBS seniors indicated that they ‘plan to’ or have completed ‘a practicum, internship, field experience, co-op experience, or clinical assignment’ and a ‘culminating senior experience’ than the UA and AAU samples.
- When asked to what extent their institution has contributed to ‘working effectively with others’, SBS first-years and seniors reported less experience than the UA sample and AAU peers.
- SBS seniors reported less experience with the institution’s contribution to ‘thinking critically and analytically’, ‘analyzing quantitative problems’, and to ‘acquiring job or work-related knowledge and skills’ than the UA and AAU samples.
- Both first-years and seniors in SBS rated the quality of advising lower than the UA sample and their AAU peers.
- SBS seniors rated their ‘entire educational experience at this institution’ lower than the UA and AAU sample.

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
